Drinking Water State Revolving Funds

The (DWSRF) Drinking Water State Revolving Fund makes funds available to drinking water systems to pay for infrastructure improvements. This loan program is funded through federal and state money. The program provides low-interest preconstruction and construction loans or grants to publicly owned (municipal) and privately owned drinking water systems. These loans or grants cover capital improvements that increase public health and compliance with drinking water regulations. Recently the City has received approval for 3 projects that were identified in the 2011 Preliminary Engineering Report (PER). These projects are line replacement's on Chico Dr. & 8th Street, Cabin Site tank rehabilitation and North Grand Avenue Water line improvements. These three projects are critical to the City's water system and the improvements will keep the City's water system safe, reliable and will help ensure the City remains in compliance with all state and federal regulations.
