This Week's Topic:

Important Information About Lead in Your Drinking Water

Testing your home's drinking water is the only way to confirm if lead is present. You may want to test your water if your home has lead service lines (lead is dull gray metal that is soft enough to be easily scratched with a house key), or your non-plastic plumbing was installed before 1986. If you discover that you have high levels of lead in your home, you should consider using bottled water or a water filter. There are many home water filters that are certified for effective lead reduction, but devices that are not designed to remove lead will not work. Lead and copper will be sampled between 6/1 to 9/31 by Utilities Water Quality Technicians. If you would like your residential water lines tested for lead and copper please call 505.426.3314.
