

# Your Friday Water Report

## This Week's Topic:

### Additional Water Storage - Purchase Complete

July 27th, 2018 is a day that will be remembered for the completion of the City's acquisition of 800 Acre Feet (AF) of permanent water storage. The city has officially closed on the Storrie storage agreement. This project was a result of months of discussions and negotiations by city staff and the city's consultants, on behalf of the Mayor, Councilors and Residents of the City of Las Vegas, and Storrie Project Water Users Association. The city's consultants are the Pete Dominici law firm, Glorietta Geoscience Inc. and DL Sanders. Citizens can now rest a little easier that the city owns 1300 AF of raw water storage between Peterson Reservoir, Bradner Reservoir and Storrie Lake. Since the Bradner rehabilitation project is scheduled to be completed in late 2018 and with the acquisition of storage in Storrie the City will have increased its usable raw water from 200 AF to 1300 AF. That is a 650% increase in water available for use during droughts, low river flows and to support the Acequias during times of need.
