Applications are being accepted for a full time Waste Water Laborer for the City of Las Vegas Waste Water Division.

Entry Level: \$8.28 (*Pay is negotiable based on training, experience and CDL Certification*)

Nature of Job: This is an entry level position. This is unskilled to semi-skilled work in the maintenance and repair of the Waste Water Treatment Facility and Collection System. Work is performed under direct supervision. Performs general maintenance and construction work as well as operational duties. Assists in the maintenance of the treatment plant. Performs routine maintenance functions and custodial duties in treatment facility as well as cleaning of treatment facility grounds. Assists in maintenance, repair and construction of collection system. Performs daily maintenance duties such as cleaning tanks and manholes. Certain laboratory tasks. Other duties as assigned. Ability to communicate orally and in writing. Ability to understand and follow oral and written instructions. Ability to operate hand tools and light equipment. Use of power tools and equipment, heavy diesel equipment. Knowledge of safety rules related to construction and utility operations. Considerable knowledge of functions, operating methods and maintenance of light and medium size equipment. Knowledge of tools and types of equipment used in public works and waste water utility operations.

Qualifications: High School Diploma or Equivalent. Valid New Mexico Class D drivers license (**CDL License is highly desired**), with good driving record. Must be insurable by City's insurance carrier. **Must possess or obtain CDL license within 6 months of employment.** Requires driving of jet rodder, sewer rodder, dumptrucks, bobcat loader, pickup trucks. Position is Safety Sensitive and subject to drug testing. to drive automobiles, pickups, dump trucks, service vehicles. Must obtain Level 1 Waste Water Certification within two (2) years of employment as outlined in the New Mexico Water Quality Commission Regulations if advancement is desired. At least one (1) year experience in utility construction, building trades or vehicle maintenance field. Ability to communicate orally and in writing. Ability to understand and follow oral and written instructions. Ability to operate hand tools and light equipment. Use of power tools and equipment, heavy diesel equipment.
