Applications are being accepted for a full time **Water Treatment Plant & Supply Operator IV** for the City of Las Vegas Water Department.

**Entry Level:** Per Pay Plan – \$16.53

**Nature of Job:** This is a task-oriented position involving all phases of a water supply filtration and supply system. Work includes a range of tasks as they relate to the maintenance and operation of a water supply system and other assigned duties. Work is evaluated on the basis of observations of Water Supply Plant Supervisor as well as results of performance. May be required to give some supervision to others. Involved in operation of all valves in supply system. Involved in all aspects of operation and maintenance of water supply source, involved with maintenance and operation of Conventional Treatment System, Mixed Media Filtration, Clarification Basin, Waste Water Lift Station, Chlorine Induction System, Raw Water Pump and Lift Stations. Involved with records and reports for E. I. D. Involved in the use of a wide range of chemical treatment, performs all operations from raw water collection, Storrie Lake Pump Station and storage to treatment from treatment plant. May be required to direct or supervise assigned work with other operators or subordinates, may be required to assist supply system crews when emergency situations arise. **Qualifications:** High school Diploma or Equivalent. Some college education in water related field desirable. Valid New Mexico Class D drivers license, with good driving record. Must be insurable by City's insurance carrier. Must possess a New Mexico Water Level IV Operator Certification. Minimum for five (5) years experience in Water Supply Treatment System. Three (3) years experience with two (2) years of college education in biology can be substituted. Must be familiar with meters and operations, basic electronics, water hydrology, chlorination, fluoridation, pipefitting, well operation and maintenance. Ability to communicate to the public about water systems and conduct tours for public relations. Must be able to make constant on-site decisions that affect the health and welfare of City residents. Knowledge in all phases of water operations. Familiar with all E. I. D. and state regulations. Knowledge of meters and operation, basic electronics, water hydrology, chlorination, fluoridation, pipefitting, well operation, and maintenance. Knowledge of new methods of operation by attending schools.
